The world is a scary place with many people you do not know hiding behind their screens. Often these people are not who they say they are and you must learn to spot a friend from a foe.



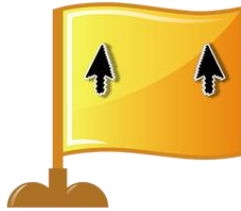
ZIP IT

BLOCK IT

NEVER give away personal details such as your phone number or address online to someone you do not know. They may be able to get in touch with you and hurt you.
