

Internet Safety

Almost everyone uses the internet. For research, schoolwork, social networking, gaming e.t.c. However, it is important to stay safe when using the internet as there are many dangers...

- 8. Make sure to check with your parents before downloading any software as it could be harmful to your computer.
- 10. Make sure to check everything you read on the internet as not everything there is true. Check that you are using a reliable website and avoid using things like yahoo or wiki answers for research as answers can be given by anyone so may not necessarily be true.

- 3. If someone sends you a nasty message make sure not to delete it as if the police get involved it can be used as evidence. Tell your parents or an adult you trust about the message. Never respond to the message as this could cause more problems.
 - 6. Never arrange to meet with a stranger unless your parents have given permission or are able to be present. Even if you think you know who they are, you could be wrong.
